Welcome. Thank you for attending this evening's Special Meeting. We seek your complete understanding of the purpose of this meeting and how you can effectively be involved in this important issue. Attached is an **informational handout** describing background information about the relocation of Tent City4 from Bothell to Woodinville.

This meeting will allow:

- ◆ City of Woodinville representatives to present overviews of the permit process identified to review a temporary homeless encampment project
- ◆ King County staff member to present an update on the efforts of the recently formed Citizens' Advisory Commission on Homeless Encampments and long-term strategies to end homelessness in King County
- ◆ Woodinville City Council to accept public comment on the proposal to enact an emergency ordinance that would allow for the interim use of city-owned park land for Tent City4 while a new Temporary Use Permit application could be filed.

Opening Remarks by Mayor Don Brocha

Woodinville Mayor Don Brocha will open the Special Meeting by stating the purpose of the meeting, encouraging respectful behavior and explaining how public comment will be received. As this is a City Council meeting, public comment will be accepted on a 3-minute limit and recorded. In addition, as with all City Council meetings, Roberts Rules of Order will be adhered to.

II. Written Questions:

Written questions will be accepted up to 7:00 p.m., sorted by topic similarity and presented to the Council and/or panelists. Table space is available to you in the lobby area.

Official Party of Record Comment for Temporary Use Permit Applications

By reading the **attached City News Release** dated 8/9/2004, you'll have a better sense of the current status of the relocation of Tent City4. There is an active Temporary Use Permit application (#2004-066) for TC4 to be located on the property of the Northshore United Church of Christ, 18900-168th Ave. NE. Should SHARE/WHEEL accept the City's proposal to relocate on to publicly-owned land, a new TUP application must be filed. This new application will prompt a new comment period and Public Hearing before the Hearing Examiner. Written comments received regarding TUP2004-066 will become void.
