Construction Updates:

Spring Tree Trimming: Routine trimming maintenance will occur throughout the summer along the following streets:

- 124th Avenue NE – NE 169th Street to NE 149th Court
- Woodinville Snohomish Road – 175th Street to 140th Avenue NE
- 132nd Avenue NE / 131st Avenue NE – NE 180th Street to NE 197th Street and NE 203rd Court to 244th Street SE
- 140th Avenue NE – NE 183rd Street to 179th Street
- NE 186th Street – 132nd Avenue NE to 136th Avenue NE

Tree trimming along the above streets will be done to protect Puget Sound Energy's (PSE) Power Lines; Asplundh will be performing the work. Capital Improvement Plan Open House: On June 10, 2010 from 4:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. an Open House will be held in the Evergreen Room of the Carol Edwards Center (17401 133rd Avenue NE, Woodinville) to take suggestions on potential future Capital Improvement Projects. The City is asking citizens to identify needed capital projects as the City evaluates its list of Capital Improvement Projects for the 2011-2012 budget development. A capital improvement project is a major, non-routine expenditure for property acquisition, new construction, or improvement to existing buildings, facilities, land, or infrastructure (which includes roads) with an estimated useful life of five or more years and a total cost of \$50,000 or more. If you have a project that you would like the City to consider, here is your chance to nominate a project. Please send in your nomination by June 10, 2010. This will allow staff the opportunity to assess the project in relation to available funding and City priorities. For more information regarding the Capital Improvement

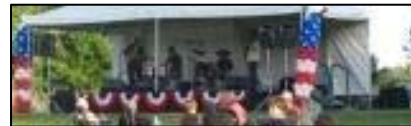

Tips on how to help keep Washington Waters clean: As summer weather begins to move in, more people will take advantage of the warm weather and wash their vehicles out on the driveway. Changing this habit provides a great way for individuals to help create clean water. When you wash your car on the driveway, the dirt and oil (along with the soap) runs straight from your driveway to the closest storm drain. Storm drains run directly into your surrounding streams, lakes, rivers, or marine waters. The dirt and oil sent to the water in this manner just creates more pollution in our waterways. Soap may also contribute to water pollution as it often contains phosphates, which may cause algae growth. Algae growth creates impacts which affect water quality and change the native habitat. Fortunately, a few solutions will make it easy for you to do your part in helping to keep our water clean.



- Wash your vehicle on the lawn or other surfaces where water can seep into the ground;
- Take your car to a commercial car wash, either self-serve or machine wash;
- Divert run-off water away from the storm drain if you use the driveway

City Street Light Reporting: Did you know that you can report street light outages directly to Puget Sound Energy (PSE)? Reporting street light outages directly to PSE can expedite the process to restore broken lights. When reporting a light outage or problem to PSE, remember to gather some basic information that includes the location of the light pole in question, light pole number, and the type of problem. If you need to report a street, storm water, or public works maintenance emergency after hours, please call 911. A crew will be dispatched to the site as necessary.
