CITY NEWS

Construction Updates:

Sammamish River Outfall Project: Work has begun on the Sammamish River Outfall Project in the northern portion of Wilmot Gateway Park. As a result, a section of the Sammamish River Trail in Wilmot Gateway Park will be rerouted to accommodate construction. Construction began in June 2010 and is scheduled to be completed by September 2010. The project includes a new 48-inch storm water pipe (to replace the existing 30-inch pipe), as well as a new 10'x44' precast concrete water quality treatment vault that will clean street water runoff before it enters the Sammamish River. Signs announcing the detour and construction work will be posted in the park and along the trail. City Tips:

Tips on how to help keep Washington Waters clean: As summer weather begins to move in, more people will take advantage of the warm weather and wash their vehicles on the driveway. Unfortunately, what seems good for your car is not so good for our natural environment. When you wash your car on the driveway, the dirt, and oil (along with the soap) runs straight from your driveway to the closest storm drain. Storm drains run directly into your surrounding streams, lakes, rivers, or marine waters. The dirt and oil sent to the water in this manner just creates more pollution in our waterways. Soap may also contribute to water pollution as it often contains phosphates, which may cause algae growth. Algae growth creates impacts, which affects water quality and changes the native habitat.



Fortunately, changing a few of your car-washing habits will make it easy for you to do your part in helping to keep our water clean.

- Wash your vehicle on the lawn or other surfaces where water can seep into the ground;
- Take your car to a commercial car wash, either self-serve or machine wash;
- Divert run-off water away from the storm drain if you use the driveway

West Nile Virus Alert: As summer temperatures finally arrive, mosquito populations will follow. One of the concerns with mosquito's, besides being a nuisance, is that they can carry the West Nile Virus. West Nile can infect people, horses, and many types of birds, as well as other animals. The majority of people who are infected with the virus will not get sick, although the few that do may experience severe symptoms (high fever, convulsions, muscle weakness, paralysis, and others). City Hall Lost and Found: As more people are using the Woodinville Sports Fields, the City is finding items left on the fields. City Street Light Reporting: Did you know that you can report street light outages directly to Puget Sound Energy (PSE)? Reporting street light outages directly to PSE can expedite the process to restore broken lights. When reporting a light outage or problem to PSE, remember to gather some basic information that includes the location of the light pole in question, light pole number, and the type of problem.
