Preserve the City's Local Control Under the Growth Management Act

Woodinville is prepared for the housing and jobs allocations the City is asked to accommodate while preserving the aspects of Woodinville that our residents and the region continues to enjoy. The City has already begun financing the design process and seeks to partner with the State for construction of the State Route project and IS SEEKING \$5 MILLION IN FUNDING TO BEGIN CONSTRUCTION.
